

## Soil Nail Launcher Saves Time and Money

An emergency slope repair along Route 36 proved to be the perfect testing ground for applying a new technology on the state system. The Soil Nail Launcher, provided by Soil Nail Launcher, Inc., can complete slide repairs in just a few days and provide added strength. Adapted from British military technology, the launcher uses compressed air to send 1.5-inch steel bars 20 feet or more into the soil. The bars traveling up to 220 miles per hour create a shock wave causing the soil to jump away and allowing the bar to pass. The soil then collapses around the bar creating a powerful bond. ## Solutions At Work to Share MoDOT Best Practices

Beginning November 1, department employees will have a new way to share better, faster and cheaper ways to get work done. Solutions At Work will recognize employees who have put their best ideas to work on the job with up to 16 hours' leave or \$300. The process begins with a short five-question form that can be completed on MoDOT's internal Web. Organizational Results staff will work with technical experts and department managers to evaluate the potential best practice. Approved best practices will be available to MoDOT employees through department's computer system. MoDOT will evaluate the Solutions At Work program following a six-month statewide pilot.
